If you plan to leave Australia while on a Bridging visa, you will need to apply for a Bridging visa B (BVB): www.homeaffairs.gov.au/BVB

You will need to be granted a Bridging visa B before you depart Australia. A Bridging visa B allows you to leave and return to Australia while your Temporary Activity (subclass 408) application is being processed.

When does my Bridging visa end?

If your application is granted, your Bridging visa will end and your new visa will become active.

Bridging A visa conditions

8107 – Not cease or change work

Condition 8107 in Schedule 8 of the Migration Regulations 1994 sets out restrictions on your employment in Australia. This information provides a summary of some of those restrictions.

If your last visa (other than a bridging visa) was a subclass 457, you must comply with the following:

- you must only work in the occupation listed in the most recently approved nomination for you
- you must only work for your sponsor (except in limited circumstances set out in the Migration Regulations)
- you must not cease employment for a period that exceeds 60 consecutive days
- you must hold any licence, registration or membership that is mandatory to perform the occupation nominated in relation to you
- you must comply with each condition or requirement to which the licence, registration or membership is subject
- you must notify us in writing as soon as practicable if the licence, registration or membership ceases to be in force, or is revoked or cancelled, or if an application for the licence, registration or membership is refused
- you must not engage in work that is inconsistent with the licence, registration or membership, including any conditions or requirements to which the licence, registration or membership is subject.
